General Rules

- A. Each entry must have 4" x 6" double spaced, typed narration beginning with the project and class number due at the Extension Office on Pre-registration day-July 11.
- B. 4-Hers may model one garment for each project carried. Sewing for You exhibitors may model in two different classes.
- C. A top stylist from each of the project areas will be chosen with a Champion Model and a Reserve Champion Model being named from the Senior age group and Junior Model being named from the Junior age group.
- D. Each contestant should choose or make accessories to complete the outfit modeled.
- E. Garments entered as "other garments" may not be modeled.
- F. All garments modeled must be entered for construction judging. Upon completion of modeling, remove the garment, place on hanger, and enter with other constructed garments for judging.
- G. To receive premium money, 4-Hers are required to model in the Public Modeling on August 4 at 7:00 p.m. at the Multi-Purpose Hall at the fairgrounds. Modeling garments may be checked out of the 4-H Exhibit Building between 6:00 p.m. and 6:45 p.m., with the participants ready to model by 7:00 p.m. Garments must be returned to the exhibit building immediately after the modeling. If a 4-Her cannot participate in the public modeling, the Home Educator or the 4-H Coordinator should be notified prior to the Revue. It will be left to the discretion of the 4-H Council if the 4-Her will receive their premium.
- H. All garments must remain on display during the county fair.
- I. One model plus one alternate (age 10 or older as of January 1 of current year) will be selected from the State Fair Modeling. The following projects qualify for State Fair: Clothing Level II, Decorate Your Duds, Sewing For You and Tailoring.

Division C410, Fashion Revue

Decorate Your Duds

State Fair eligible only – Garment constructed from an Original Designed Fabric. Fabric is made first, then a garment is constructed from the fabric. Examples include: painting on fabric, color discharge, shibori tie eyeing, weaving fabric strips, crazy piecing and paper piecing, and color blocking fabric pieces. Other embellishments may be added. Embellishment garment with original design entries and textile clothing accessory entries are NOT accepted.

Seniors (12 and Up)

Juniors (8-11) 4-H exhibitors 10 years and older, as of January 1 of current year are eligible for State Fair.

Clothing Level 2 Modeling

4-H exhibitors 10 years and older, as of January 1 of current year are eligible for State Fair

4-H members who have enrolled in or who have completed Sewing for You or Tailoring projects are not eligible. A purchased top can be worn to complete a vest or jacket outfit with a skirt, pants or shorts. Those wanting to model night shirts or loungewear must have the garment approved by Fashion Revue Superintendents or the Home Extension Educator or 4-H Coordinator.

C410015* Junior (Ages 8-11) Possible types of garments include dress; skirted outfit – skirt with shirt, vest or jacket; jumper and shirt; or pant outfit – pants or shorts with shirt, vest or jacket OR jogging outfit.

C410020* Senior (Ages 12-19) Possible types of garments include dress; skirted outfit – skirt with shirt, vest or jacket jumper and shirt; or pant outfit – pants or shorts with shirt, vest or jacket OR jogging outfit.

Sewing For You Modeling

Those wanting to model nightwear or loungewear must have the garment approved by Fashion Revue Superintendents or the Home Extension Educator or 4-H Coordinator. Those modeling nightwear or loungewear will not be considered for state fair modeling.

C410030* Dress; Skirted Outfit (skirt with shirt, vest, or jacket OR jumper and shirt); Formal (dress or tuxedo for prom, wedding or other formal occasion); Pants Outfit (pants or shorts with shirt, vest, or jacket); Specialty Wear (costume); Sportswear (jogging outfit, swim wear, aerobic wear, or ski wear); Coat/Outerwear/Jacket (lined or unlined, non-tailored. and Western Wear (chaps, chinks, or riding attire).

Tailoring Modeling

Additional pieces with blazer, jacket or coat may either be constructed or purchased.

C410040* Tailored Blazer, Suit Jacket or Coat

Make One/Buy One Modeling

4-H members enrolled in Knitting, Crocheting, Clothing Level 2, Sewing for You or Tailoring may enter this class.

C410180 Combined sewn, knitted or crocheted garment(s) with a purchased item to make a complete wearable outfit. Both items must be modeled. State which garment is purchased on the narration form.

Recycled Garment Modeling

C410301 Recycled Garment

Knitting Modeling

Enter only one. Coordination of garment(s) worn with knitted garment will also be evaluated.

C410401 Juniors (Ages 8-11) Any wearable garment made in the Beginning Unit

C410402 Seniors (Ages 12-19) Any wearable garment made in the Beginning Unit

C410403 Seniors (Ages 12-19) Must be a garment made in middle or advanced unit

C410404 Other item to be modeled

Crochet Modeling

Enter only one. Coordination of garment(s) worn with knitted garment will also be evaluated.

- C410501 Juniors (Ages 8-11) Any wearable garment made in the Beginning Unit
- C410502 Seniors (Ages 12-19) Any wearable garment made in the Beginning Unit
- C410503 Seniors (Ages 12-19) Must be a garment made in middle or advanced unit
- C410504 Other item to be modeled

Attention Shoppers Modeling

This curriculum is developed and designed for youth under age 12.

- C415001 County only Modeling Option. Exhibitors who have entered Class C244003 in Consumer Management Clothing may model their garment. Narration Card **must** be turned in by Pre-registration deadline.

Shopping in Style Modeling

This curriculum is developed and designed for youth age 12 and older.

- C425004* Exhibitors who have entered Consumer Management Clothing Class C240001 may model their garment. Narration Card and form SF184 **must** be turned with Pre-registration entries. Judges will select a top model (12 years or older) to represent Box Butte County at the State Shopping In Style Fashion Review during State Fair.
